Firstly, we welcomed a member of the online safety and safeguarding team to speak with our pupils in upper key stage two about online safety, including gaming and being responsible whilst doing so. # Safeguarding Tip of the Week

#### Stranger Danger

Statistics show that crime against young children by strangers is rare. Even so, these six tips can help protect your child:

- tell your child to avoid talking to people they don't know when you're not around
- make sure your child knows never to walk away with strangers
- make sure your child understands that they should always tell you if a stranger approaches, and never to keep this secret
- if your child is travelling alone, tell them to sit near other families on the train or bus
- if your child gets lost, they should ask for help from a police officer, another grownup with children or someone working at a nearby shop
- have your children learn their address and telephone number by heart
