Online Safety Tip of the Week

Managing Online Information - KS1

Can your child show you some of the key buttons/functions on a device, such as: back/forward; down; up/down; and adjusting the volume?

<u>Managing Online Information – KS2</u>

Remind your child about 'fake news'. Ask them to consider how this can affect someone emotionally/mentally. How would they feel if someone shared a story about them that impacted their reputation and was completely untrue?

Right of the Week Article 36

Protection from Exploitation

This week, we reminded the children of article 36. Children have the right to be protected from all other kinds of exploitation (even if these are not explicitly mentioned in the RRSA Convention).

Sustainability Tip of the Week

Think Twice Before Binning It!

Before throwing out broken items, consider giving them a second chance through repair. Encourage your children to learn the value of resourcefulness and sustainability by involving them in the repair process. Explore local organisations and charities like the Repair Cafe, where skilled volunteers can help breathe new life into damaged goods. Not only does this teach children the importance of reducing waste, but it also fosters a sense of community and appreciation for craftsmanship. So, next time something breaks, think twice before binning it – you might just discover the joy of giving old items a new lease on life.



Safeguarding Tip of the Week

Unexplained Money or Gifts

It is important to be aware of children having unexplained gifts or money that has been given to them by other children or adults.

This could be a sign of exploitation and could lead to harmful or manipulative behaviour. Ask children open questions about who they have received this money/gift from and where they are meeting up with this person.

If you are concerned or your child is not sharing where it is from, please contact that school or local safeguarding teams for support.
