<p>Overview of the Role</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Support other pupils in Computing lessons - Supporting/explaining the online safety starters - Talking to our peers about how to stay safe online (in class, on the playground and making reference to the website) - Being role models online – both in school and out of school - Supporting others on games etc. outside of school 	
<p>Notes</p> <p>Mr Arnold asked the children if they enjoyed their summer holidays and asked if any online safety issues arose over them/since returning to school in September, they said there were no issues raised but they were online lots and used it appropriately.</p> <p>Mr Arnold then said that a letter went out yesterday inviting Y2 and Y3 children to apply to join the OSA team and explained that we would be reviewing their applications together at the start of the next half-term. If there are a lack of applications, we will go and advertise the role together during their next Computing lessons.</p> <p>Miss Ellison has recently updated the Online Safety display in the hall and asked for an update on posters. Mr Arnold set the children the challenge between now and half term to go and find Miss Ellison, ask what she wants covered in the posters, then produce high quality ones ready to be added to the display.</p> <p>Finally, we returned to the online safety worry box idea presented last year and I explained that we would create these all together for each class once the Y2/3 ambassadors have been elected. Zoe suggested splitting the box in two (shape of an iPad) and one half would be for worries and one for useful tips and suggestions.</p> <p>The team were asked if they wanted to do any specifically over the course of the year and their responses were:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Pami suggested making an online safety quiz/Blooket so it is a fun way of seeing what they know/don't know and anything they can help with. This could be on Safer Internet Day. - Sreejan said about having a place near the reading corner to celebrate online safety - Zoe/Cassia recommended having more online safety books in the library - A workshop for Y4 pupils? - Lead another assembly on Safer Internet Day – they create it together - Create a specific home learning task in spring term linked to online safety - Half-termly online safety statement of the week? (Grayson) - Any certificates for online safety at the end of the term? (Ethan) - Check with Mr Williamson if there are any cool apps linked to internet safety that he knows about
